Intro to Theology (Gr 8-12)

Introduction to Theology is intended to help the student understand what the historic church believed when answering questions such as "Who is God?" "Who Is Jesus?" "Who is the Holy Spirit?" Class lectures will include material to gain insight into the trinity, Bibliology, denominational perspectives on salvation, baptism and end times. All material is based upon scripture while remaining neutral to denominational positions and staying focused on historical orthodoxy. Class discussion is encouraged. Lecture material will make use of PowerPoint slides with supporting scripture, historic quotes, and short videos. Mind tools will include illustrations and concepts intended to provide students with a framework for their thinking. Handouts will list definitions of terms, scriptural references, and salient points from the lecture. This class is not about stories in the Bible but about what Christian foundations formed from these stories. It is important to have a basic understanding of the Bible and its principles in terms of salvation, baptism, and the trinity. Many new terms will be introduced but they are not expected to be memorized. The intent is to become comfortable around hearing them. Students are expected to read the handout material in order to contribute to the discussion.
