### **Mental Health 101 (Gr 9-Adult)**

Colorado Springs has an alarming rate of teen suicides, heartbreakingly exceeding the national average. In the past 3 years, our community has had more than 40 teen suicides. We cannot stand idly by to watch another family be ripped apart by mental illness and suicide. Many teenagers feel shame or fear about their depression and anxiety, and so they don't seek help. Students have a wonderful opportunity to discover what it means to develop a community equipped to have meaningful conversations about mental health and empowered to help those who are struggling. The objective of this course is to have students engage in constructive dialogue around the topic of mental health and helping others. Several qualified therapists at Mayfield Counseling Centers will be coming in throughout the course to teach student the basics of topics like depression, anxiety, self-care, and the brain. Students will learn to be catalysts for change in their worlds to encourage each other and be mental health champions. This class will tackle difficult conversations in a safe and welcoming environment, allowing students to ask questions, process answers, and learn to be encouragers to peers and family.
